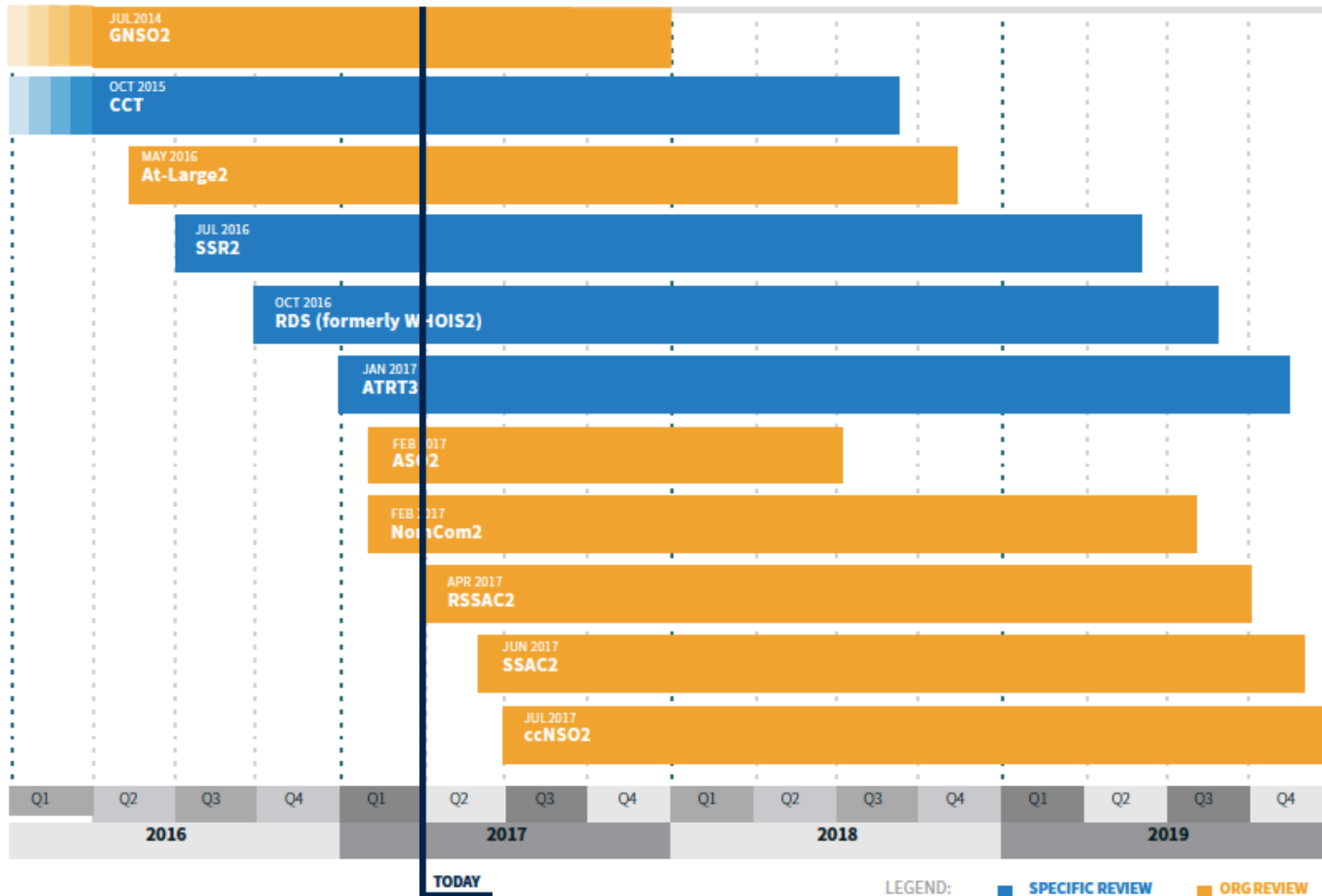

The New gTLD Program is driving the largest expansion of the Domain Name System ever. Hundreds of new top-level domain names are being introduced into the Internet on a rolling basis.

WHY IT'S IMPORTANT

IDNs at the top-level enable Internet users to access domain names in local languages and scripts.

IDN ccTLDs allow countries and territories to represent their respective names scripts other than US-ASCII characters.

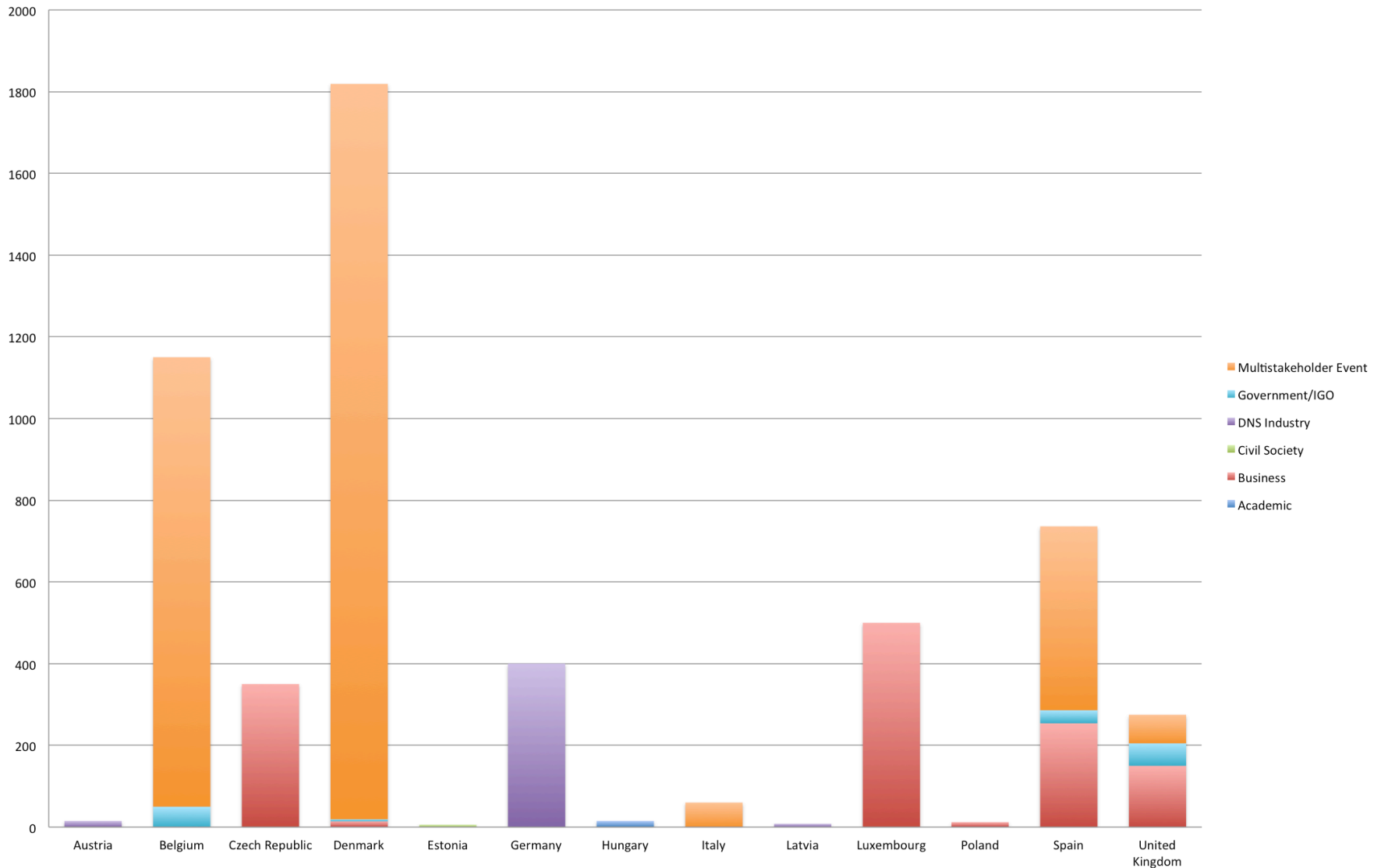

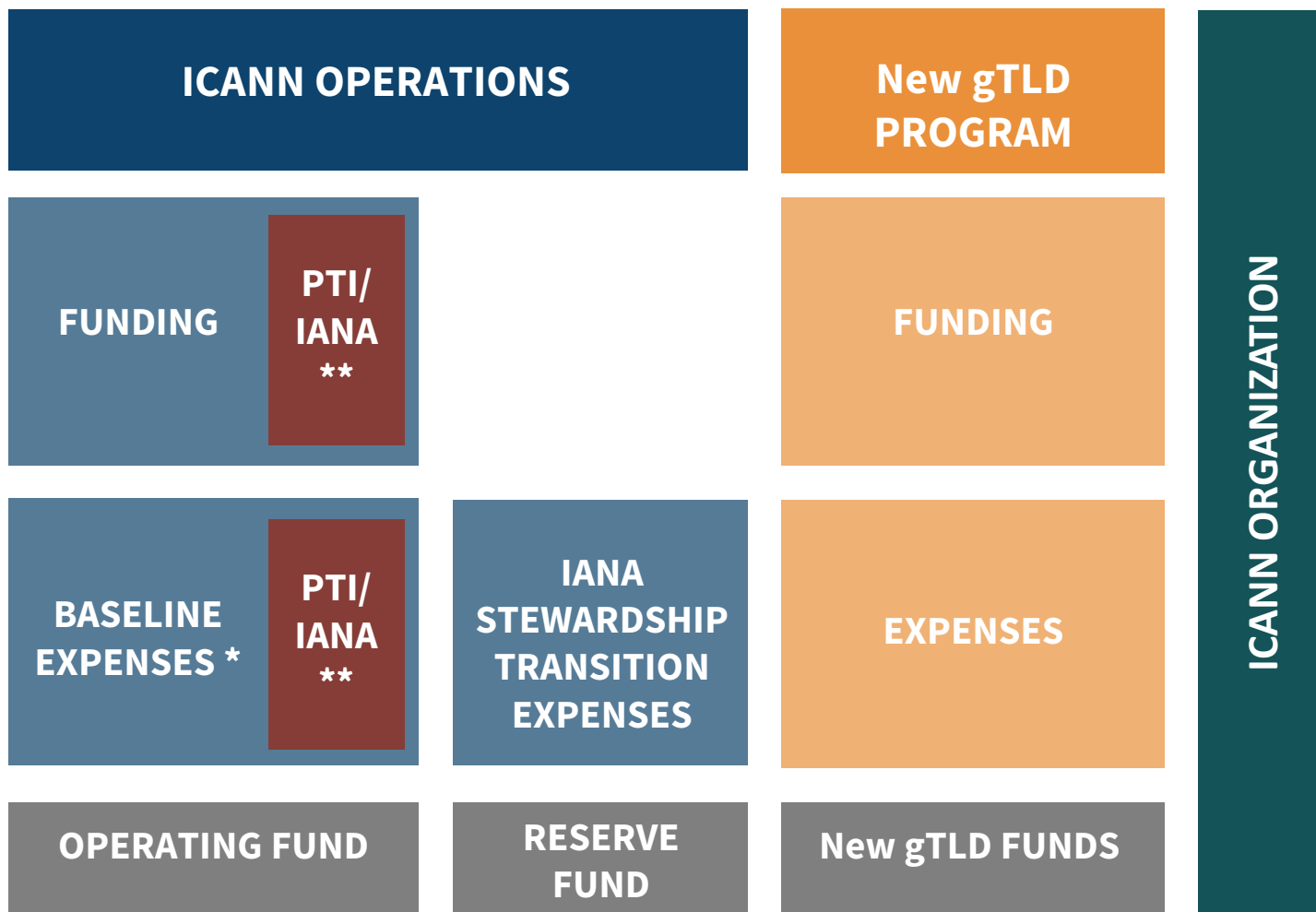

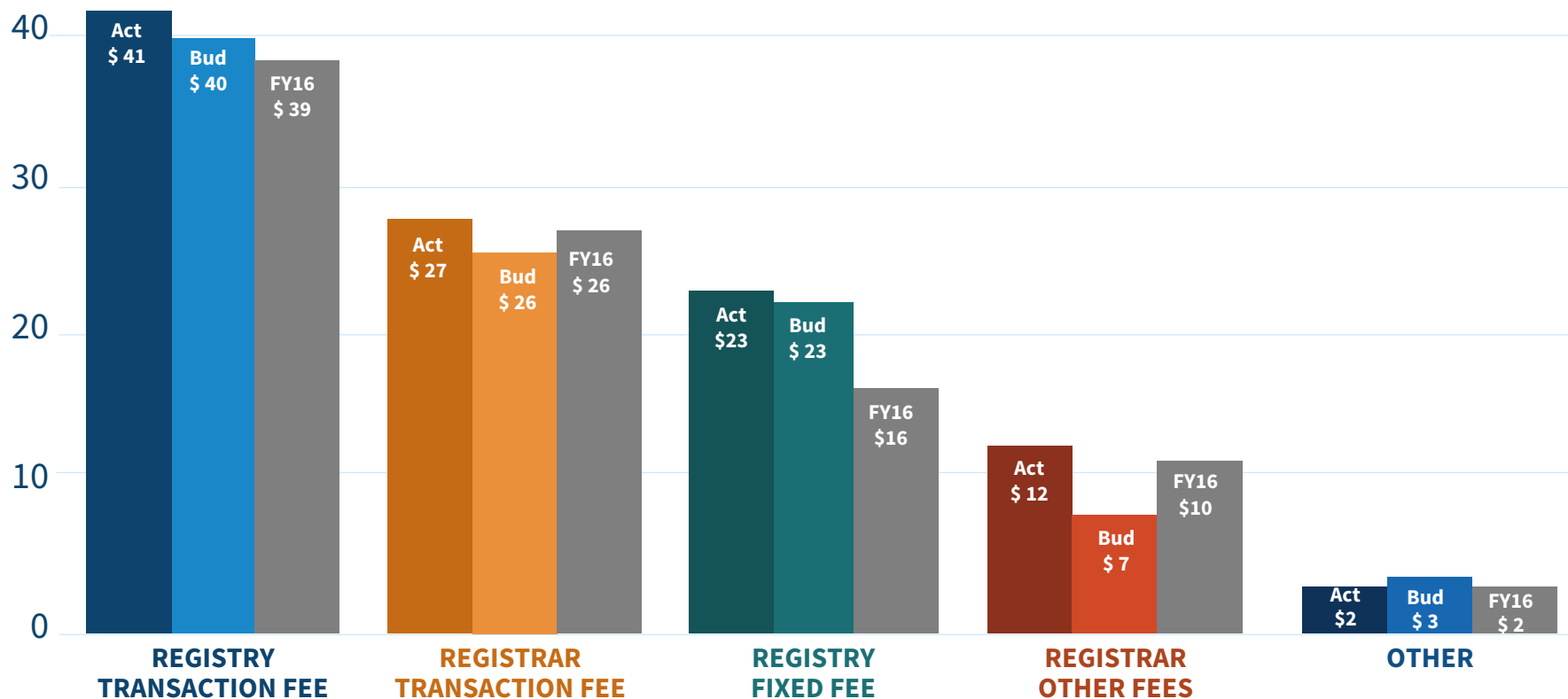

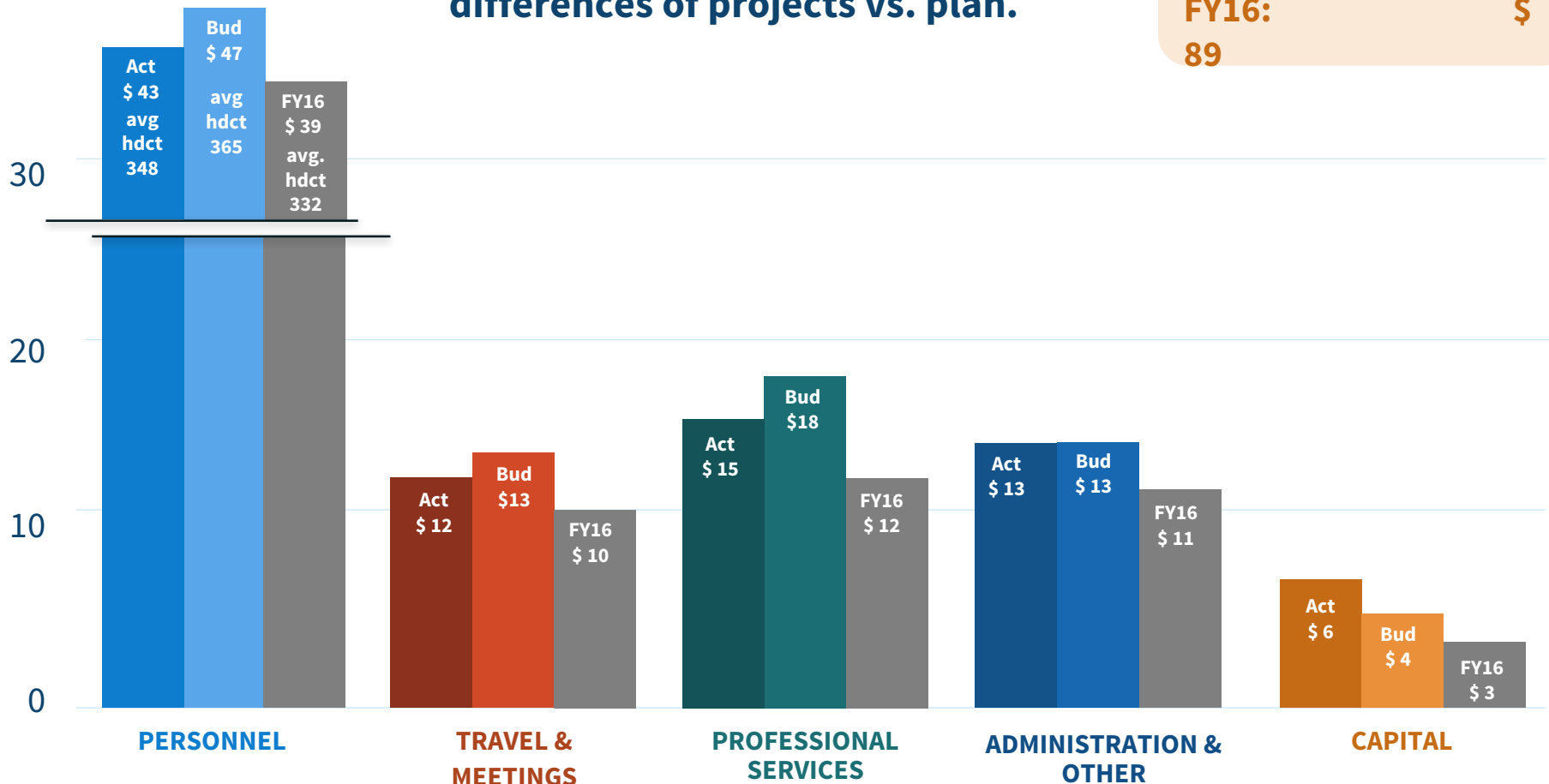


FY17 Year-to-date (Jul 16-Mar 17) Baseline Expenses vs Budget and FY16

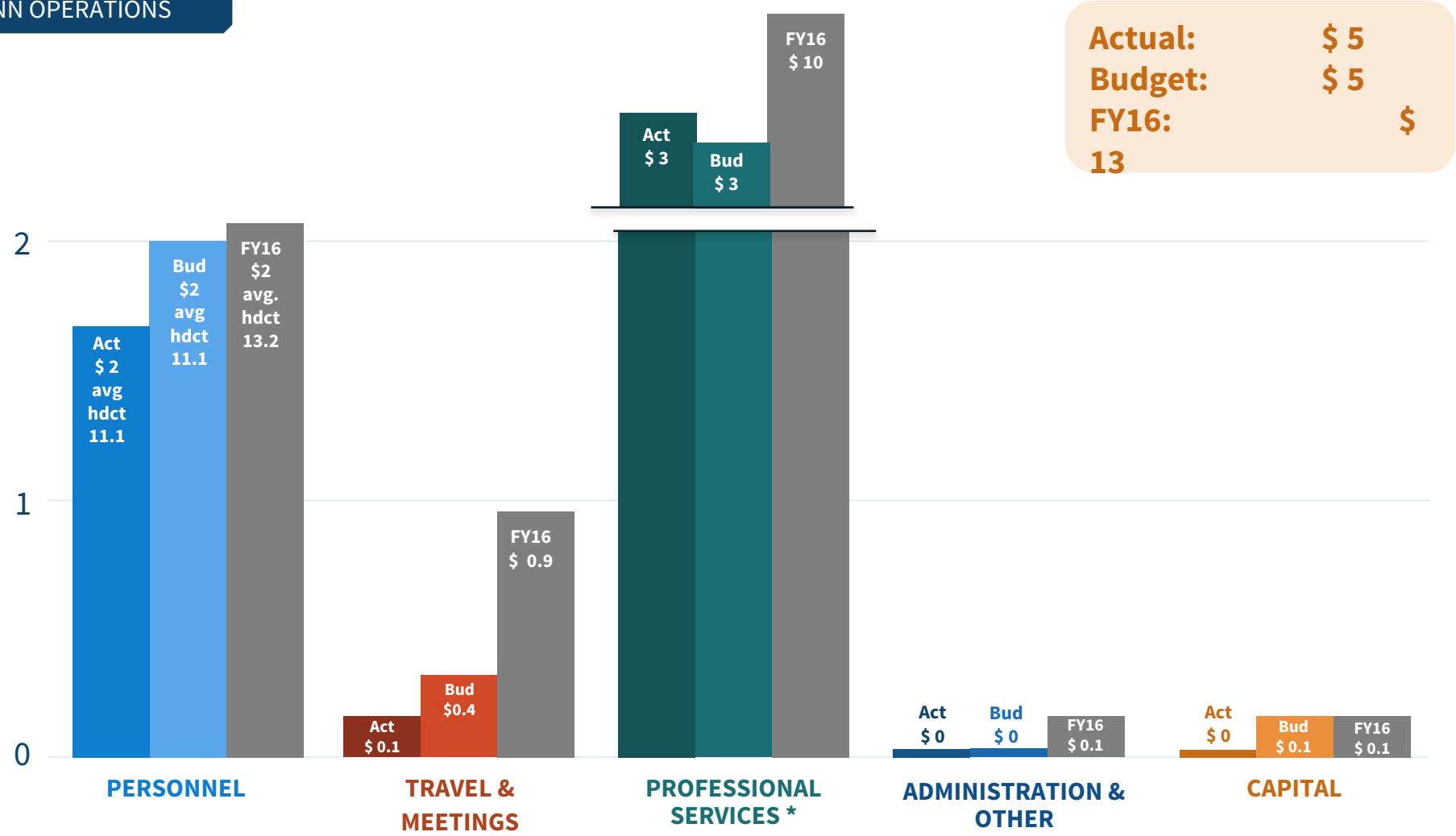

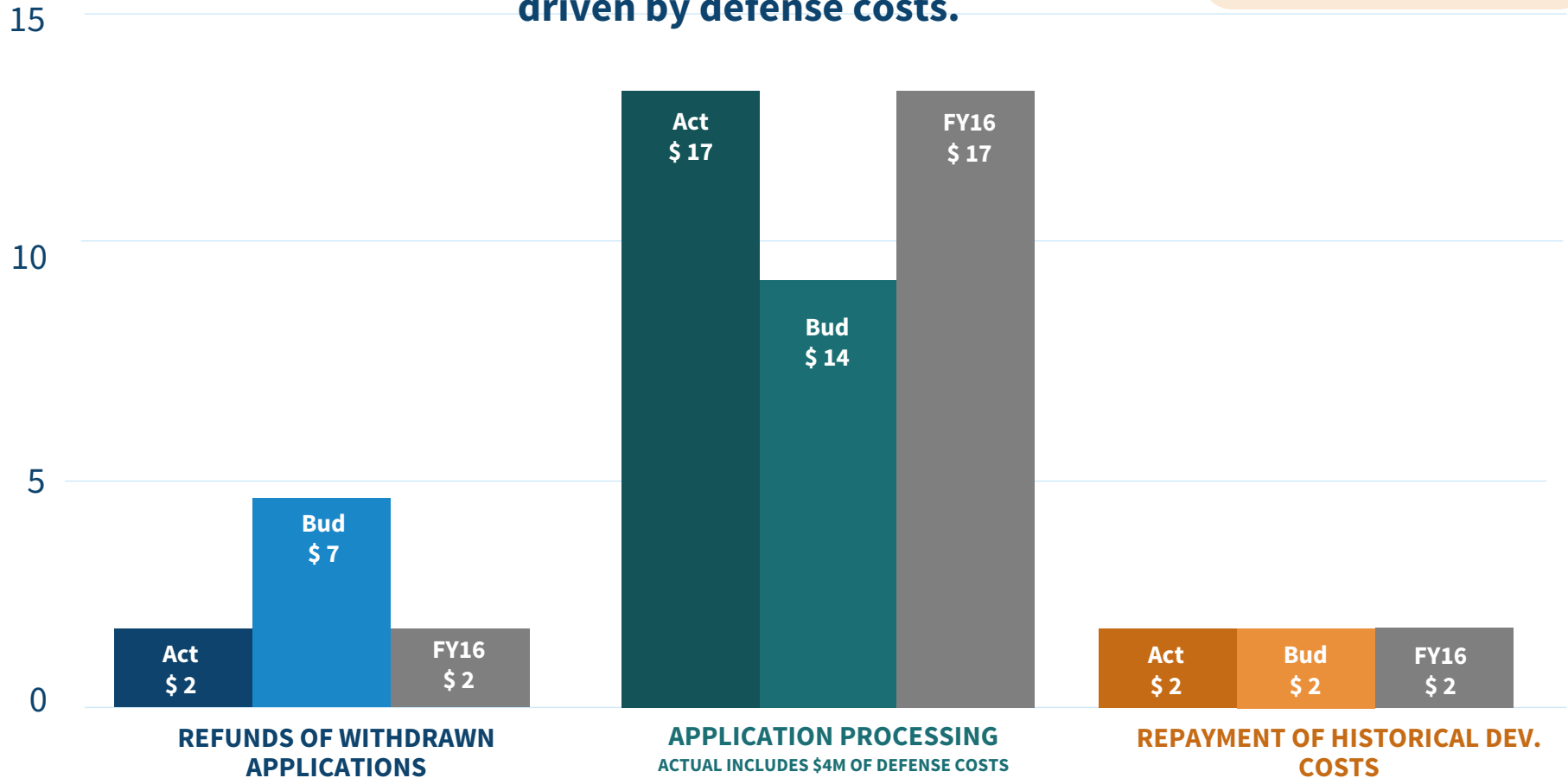


FY17 Year-to-date (Jul 16-Mar 17) New gTLD Program Expenses vs Budget and FY16

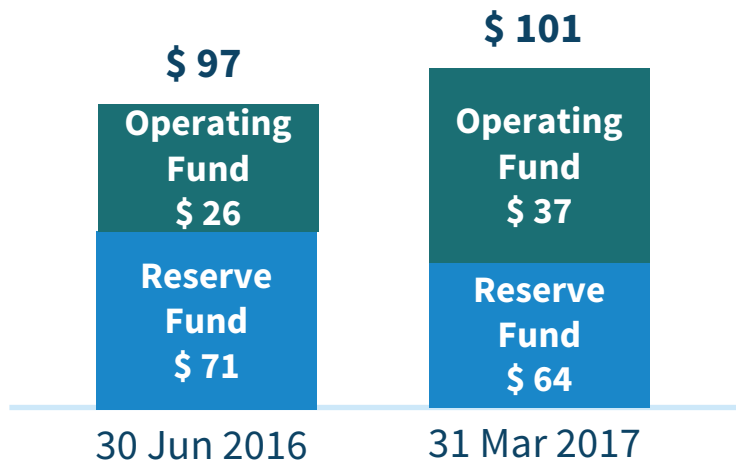

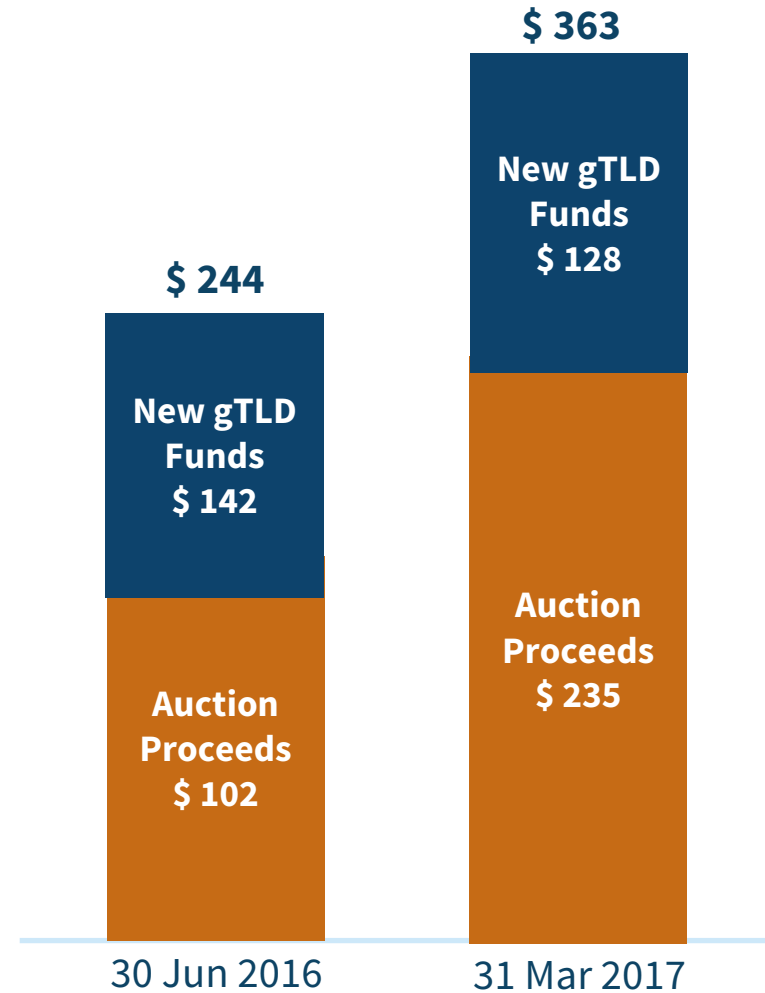

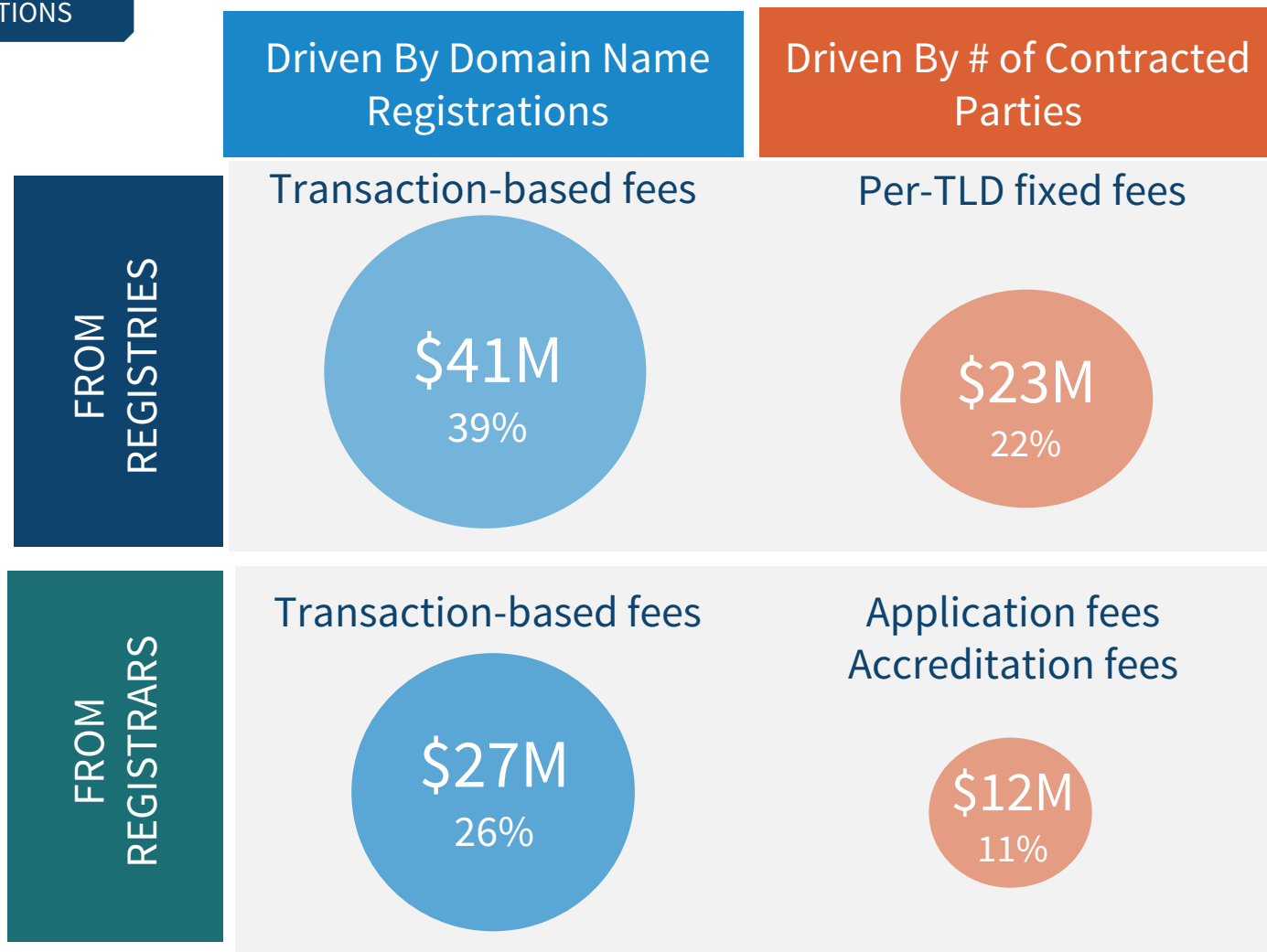

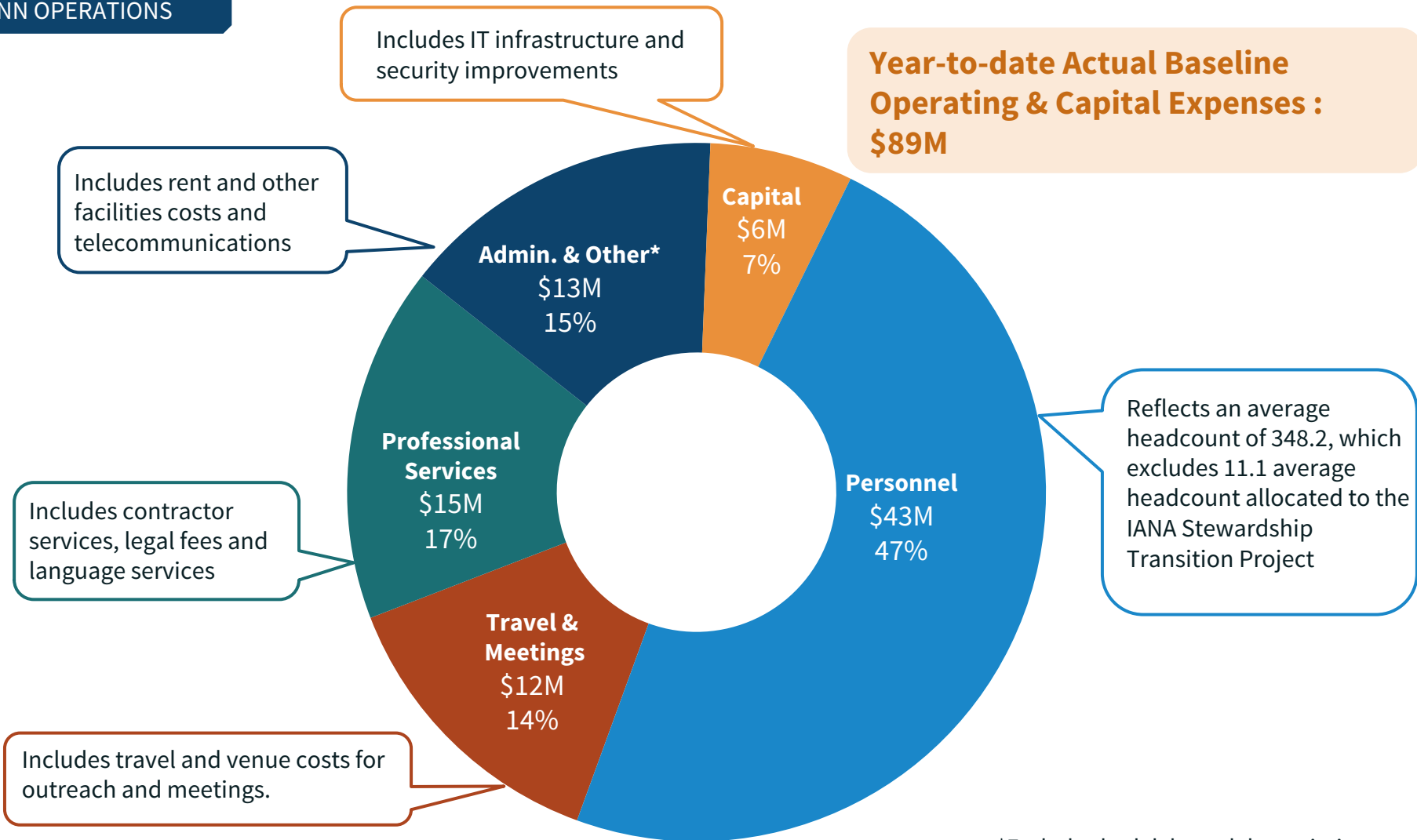
